St. Luke's MSTI patients can now receive care in 13 different locations in Southwest Idaho and Eastern Oregon. A complete range of inpatient and outpatient comprehensive services comprise the MSTI cancer program. All MSTI sites are accredited as part of St. Luke's Boise/Meridian Regional Medical Center. St. Luke's is accredited by the Joint Commission on the Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations (JCAHO). The laboratories serving MSTI are certified by

Most of St. Luke's BCDC sites feature the latest in breast screening technology: Full field Digital Mammography. MSTI has eight stationary sites in five separate Idaho cities (Boise, Meridian, Caldwell, Mountain Home, and Ketchum), and two diagnostic centers in Boise and Meridian. In addition, MSTI has one mobile unit that travels to 11 of the 20 counties MSTI serves.

MSTI's research department has expanded from its original footprint on the main campus in Boise, Idaho to include four additional MSTI cancer treatment clinics throughout southwest and south central Idaho. These clinics represent the regional direction of the entire MSTI program.

Adult medical, gynecologic and radiation oncology research protocols are offered at all MSTI facilities. Pediatric and autologous stem cell transplant protocols are offered only at the MSTI site in Boise.

MSTI is accredited by the following agencies: Southwest Oncology Group (SWOG), Clinical Trials Support Unit (CTSU), Radiation Oncology Group (ROG), Children's Oncology Group (COG), and Foundation for the Accreditation of Cellular Therapy (FACT). MSTI was most recently reviewed by SWOG, FACT, and CTSU in 2007, and COG in 2008. Accreditations are performed on a 3-year cycle.

In addition to therapeutic protocols, repository studies are also offered at MSTI. Approximately 40 protocols are available for adult medical and radiation oncology patient enrollment and approximately 60 protocols are available for pediatric oncology patient enrollment. The bone marrow transplant program has participated in clinical trials since its inception in March 1993 and MSTI has participated in clinical trials sponsored by Fred Hutchinson Cancer Center/PSOC, SWOG, BMT, CTN, and industry sponsored trials. Implementation Authority means those actions which the Member may take without the approval or recommendation of the Corporation. This authority will not be utilized until there has been appropriate communication between the Member and the Corporation's Board of Directors and its Chief Executive Officer. Actions requiring implementation authority include:

(a) Changes to the Statements of mission, philosophy, and values of the Corporation;

(b) Removal of an individual from the Corporation's Board of Directors if and when the Member determines in good faith that the Director is failing to meet the Approved Board of Member Expectations. This authority to remove Directors shall not be used merely because there is a difference in business judgment between the Director and the Corporation or the Member, and shall never be used to remove one or more Directors from the Corporation's Board of Directors in order to change a decision made by the Corporation's Board of Directors;

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(c) Employment and termination of the Chief Executive Officer of the Corporation;

(d) Appointment of the auditor for the Corporation and the coordination of the Corporation's annual audit;

(e) Sales, lease, exchange, mortgage, pledge, creation of a security interest in or other disposition of real or personal property of the Corporation if such property has a fair market value in excess of a limit set from time to time by the Member and that is not otherwise contained in an Approved Budget;

(f) Sale, merger, consolidation, change of membership, sale of all or substantially all of the assets of the corporation, or closure of any facility operated by the Corporation;

(g) The dissolution of the Corporation;

To keep that commitment, St. Luke's puts a great deal of time and effort into recruiting and retaining the top physicians in a variety of medical fields. Our relationships with physicians range from having privileges at the hospital to full employment.

For those physicians who choose to be employed, St. Luke's must offer competitive pay and benefits.

Physician compensation is based on a range of criteria and can be influenced by a number of variables including:

- Productivity
- Geography
- National surveys adjusted for local conditions

To ensure physician compensation and benefits remain within industry standards and legal requirements for not-for-profit institutions, St. Luke's has a Physician Arrangements policy that specifies circumstances requiring a third-party valuation and also periodically uses third-party consulting firms to review St. Luke's physician compensation arrangements.

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Given the growing national shortage of physicians, recruiting and retaining physicians is more critical than ever to guarantee that people seeking care at St. Luke's will continue to have access to the physicians and specialists they need regardless of their insurance status or insurance provider.
